Welcome to the North Shropshire Beekeepers' Association (NSBKA) which was founded on Friday 23 August 1945 and is, since our inception, a fully affiliated member of the British Beekeepers' Association (BBKA). We have members spread far and wide but predominantly across the northern part of the County.

The aims of the Association are to encourage and develop the art and science of bee keeping through group meetings, practical out apiary events and educational support programs in which members can participate and contribute.

Throughout the winter months (October – March), evening meetings are held where the very best speakers on bee keeping and associated activities are invited to share their specialist skills and knowledge at our monthly meeting, usually held at a local village hall. During the spring and summer months we gather at our Association apiary at an organic farm in North Shropshire to perform general hive management tasks, observe and practice bee handling techniques and share our latest bee keeping tales in order that we can all improve our understanding of bees, their behaviour and maximize our efficacy in their on-going health and performance.

We try to run the Association with minimal formality and the only recorded event is our AGM in October of each year. We have a central committee of three (Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer) re-elected annually with a tenure of no more than four consecutive years. Membership

We have divided the membership subscription form into 4 sections,

- NSBKA
- BBKA
- BDI (only required if you have bees)
- Optional Bee Craft subscription

North Shropshire Beekeepers' Association (NSBKA)

- Beekeeping Member - for the purpose of purely local club activities, spouses/other family members are treated as included under this single member subscription.
- Affiliated membership - this covers beekeepers that keep their bees under the auspices of another beekeepers' association and pay for BBKA and BDI Insurance via that association, or for those interested in the craft of beekeeping who do not keep bees.

The British Beekeepers' Association (BBKA)

Membership of the BBKA is compulsory for NSBKA members keeping bees under the auspices of this society (for insurance reasons), but not for Affiliated Members who do not keep bees. To help you choose the correct level of membership, consult the table below.

- Registered Member – a regular beekeeper member - will cover the majority of members.
- Partner Member – as the name suggests, lives at the same address as the registered member.
- Country Member – non-beekeepers who nonetheless wish to support the BBKA (similar to NSBKA Affiliated Members).

Bee Disease Insurance Limited (BDI)

Purchase is a condition of membership of BBKA for Registered *and* Partner Members and therefore, each member *must* pay at least the minimum basic premium.

Scheme A covers beekeepers with up to 39 colonies. Beekeepers must ensure they pay sufficient to insure all hives (excluding 'Apidea' or similar hives) containing bees regardless of size of the colony to ensure the insurance is not invalidated.

Bee Craft

The official journal of the BBKA is available through the NSBKA at a reduced subscription (-10%). The subscription year runs from January to December. Whilst this is optional, we recommend that all members, especially those new to beekeeping, take out this subscription.
